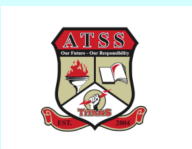
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DRESS CODE ORDER DAY WAS MAY 26

Video Games are how the Military Desensitizes young soldiers to Violence - is this what you want your Children Addicted to?

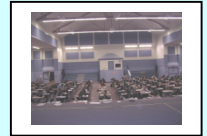
