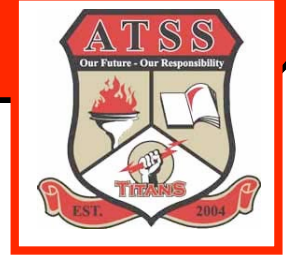

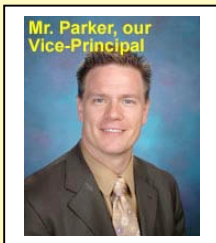

Well, exams are over and we are now off to a smooth second semester as students adjust to their new classes. Your son or daughter should be bringing home their report card on Fri, Feb. 9. Any course changes for the second semester must be done by Thurs. Feb. 15. as no further changes are allowed after that date.

We will be doing course planning for next year with our students at the end of this month so you should have a course planning form coming home to you from your son or daughter before the end of Feb. for your signature. You will notice that we have added a Pre-AP, (Advanced Placement), component to our course options. In striving for increasing program excellence, we are beginning to develop the Advanced Placement program here at ATSS. The advantage of offering the AP program is to provide further academic challenge to our students while at the same time granting first year university credit for that particular course at the Gr. 12 level for students who achieve a certain level on the AP exam. You will see on the course planning form that we are offering two pre-AP courses in Gr. 10, Math and English. As our numbers grow, we will be able to expand this into the senior grades.

The course planning forms must be signed by you as parents and we will need these to come back as soon as possible. It is important that they are returned as this declares your intention to return to ATSS next year and gives you first pick of the elective courses available. If you are not planning on attending for next year please let our office staff know as we will be moving to the wait list later in the spring. We are looking forward to expanding our programs as we grow next year.

WE HAVE PUT TOGETHER A COMMITTEE OF PARENTS; TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS TO FURTHER EXPLORE THIS ISSUE. YOUR PARENT REPRESENTATIVES ARE MRS. STRUKOFF , SPC, MR. DRAAYERS AND MRS. VERRAULT, PAC, MR. ENNIS, MRS. DEWAR AND MR. MACPHAIL, TEACHERS AND MYSELF, PRINCIPAL. Zippered Hoodie-gathered waist, with school crest..... Black
 Golf Shirt, with school crest.....Black & Beige
 Pants, dress casual, preferably Dickies brand (cords are acceptable)..Black & Beige
 Walking shorts, dress casual, preferably Dickies brand.....Black & Beige

Girls:

Zippered Hoodie-straight waist, with school crest..... Black
 Shirt-Short Sleeve, with school crest.....Black, Red & Beige
 Golf Shirt, with school crest.....Black & Red
 Tank Top, only for layering under uniform.....Black & Red
 Pants, dress casual, preferably Dickies Brand. (cords are acceptable)..Black & Beige
 Capris, dress casual,Black & Beige
 Walking Shorts, dress casual, knee length.....Black & Beige
 Skirt, A line or straight, no shorter than knee length.....Black & Beige

Unisex Items:

Hoodie-Non Zippered, with school crest.....Black
 Sweatshirt, with school crest..... Black & Beige
 Polo, with school crest.....Black & Red

PE Strip:

PE Shorts, with school crest.....Black

Restrictions:

- All tops must have the school crest.
- Pants, shorts, capris and skirts are not to have cargo pockets, zip off legs, chains, or other ornamentation, (Dickies cell phone pocket is OK). They are to be plain in style and appearance and conform to a dress pant style. No leggings, rugby pants, etc...
- Boys are allowed to wear white undershirts provided they do not hang out the bottom of their polo shirt.
- Girls are allowed to layer tank tops under their blouse provided they are red or black, no lace trim on bottom hem.
- No skin showing at mid section.
- All shorts and skirts must be at least knee length.
- Gym Strip is not to be worn in classes other than gym.
- Sweatpants are a gym strip item only, not to be worn in classes other than gym.
