



### Principal's Message

Well another semester has come to a quick end as the time has flown by quickly. We are currently settling into a new semester as students are being introduced to new teachers or to others they have not had for a while. Report cards are being handed out to students today to bring home. Please check with your son or daughter, as they will have them.

We seem to be having a problem this second semester especially with many students arriving late to school. We have averaged upwards of 20-30 each morning for this past week. This is very disruptive, both for our office personnel and our teachers. As we are teaching our students to be ready for the "real world", punctuality is an important life skill. We would urge you to please ensure that your son or daughter is here on time. We do have a study hall for those who are late without a valid reason in an attempt to hold students accountable for their punctuality. We appreciate your ongoing efforts in this area.

Mr. Hall, our counsellor, has been working with our students to accommodate course change requests. We do the best we can to accommodate legitimate student requests. Also I would like to take this time to formally welcome Ms. Jantzen to our staff replacing Mrs. Royer in the Art dept. She comes to us with a degree and expertise in Fine Arts and English. We welcome her to our staff.

It will be important for you to know as parents that we will be doing course planning for grades 8-11 in the next few weeks. Mr. Hall will be going into the different classrooms and explaining the process to each grade. He will begin on Friday, Feb. 13 at the Middle School with the Gr. 8's. The Grade 9's will be on Wednesday, Feb. 18, the Gr. 10's will be on both Monday, Feb. 9 and Wednesday Feb. 11 and the Gr. 11's on Monday, Feb. 16. You should see a copy of the course planning form with the selection of courses. It does require a parent/guardian signature to verify the student's selection so you can expect to see this in the next two weeks or so. We do hope you take the time to have a discussion with your son or daughter as to which courses would best suit both their future plans and individual skills.

#### City of Abbotsford Announces Safe Harbour

- All Abbotsford recreation facilities are now designated 'Safe Harbour locations', Mayor, George W. Peary announced today.
- Safe Harbour locations provide temporary refuge for people who experience discrimination or harassment, to receive a helping hand such as a place to sit, a glass of water, a telephone to use, and/or information about how to seek further assistance. Each Safe Harbour location displays a colourful window decal and other signage that signifies that management and staff at that location have been trained in the program.
- "The City of Abbotsford has taken another step towards making our community safer and more inclusive," said Peary. "As designated Safe Harbour locations, the City of Abbotsford recreation centres are taking a leadership role in the community by welcoming diversity and treating all members of the community with respect."

- Abbotsford Recreation Centre, 34690 Old Yale Road;
- MSA Arena, 2323 Emerson Street;
