



Principal's Message

We are getting ever closer to that final run where exams are the last remaining activity of the year. We have simply had too many issues with personal laptops. Issues around inappropriate website use, a lack of programs needed for certain courses, concerns over the use of unlicensed software and the unavailability of a laptop when a personal one breaks down leaving a students at times for months without access to a laptop. We have continually worked with the district and our suppliers to give parents the best value for their money. There is no attempt to make this program profitable in any way. We are anticipating our Grad Prom and Convocation coming up in the next couple of weeks. This is an exciting time for all as our graduates are finally leaving the educational shelter they have had for 12 or more years. 
ATSS Music Concert

To Abbotsford Students, Parents and Community Members:

Abbotsford Police Chief, Bob Rich announced today that all people, including youth, who have connections at any level - either indirectly or directly - to gang activity through the sale and distribution of drugs or other criminal activity are at grave risk of personal harm. Recent events suggest that even those who are unaware of potential gang connections can be targeted. The Chief made this unprecedented announcement today in an effort to mobilize the community to help prevent any further loss of life.

The Chief also announced the activation of a youth and parent Help Line, 604-864-4787. The Help Line is available 24 hours per day, seven days per week for youth, concerned parents and community members to call if they want help ending their involvement in gangs or other criminal activity.

The Abbotsford Police Department, School District 34 and The City of Abbotsford are working together to ensure the safety and security of our youth and our community.

Students with questions or concerns are encouraged to speak to any adult they trust including parents, teachers, counsellors, school liaison officers, or call the Help Line at 604-864-4787.
