IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR GRAND MARCH

Directions for Parking and Traffic Flow for our Grand March, Fri. May 10

- * The arrival of Grads begins at 4:15 pm, Grand March begins promptly at 5:10 pm.
- * A section of the ATSS parking lot will be reserved for grads and grad drop-off vehicles that are arriving.
- * The bus lanes of ATSS will be kept clear for the arrival of busses to take the grads to their Prom Dinner.
- * The front of ATMS, middle school, (drive-thru area) will also be kept clear for the arriving grads.
- * Grads arrive by coming through the South entrance to the middle school, drive by the front of ATMS, and only the vehicles of our grads and their drivers will be allowed to the rear of the campus. The grads or their drivers then come around to the front of the school and park.
- * Prior to the Grads arriving, there will be limited parking behind the middle school however once the grads begin to arrive, no other vehicles will be allowed to park behind the middle school.
- * Additional Parking for guests will have to be along the street, please be mindful of our neighbors and avoid parking blocking their Driveways.

Subject: Transportation/Bus Fee Changes September 2013

Please be aware that as of the start of the 2013-2014 school year this September, all eligible riders of school district buses will be charged \$200 a year. So, fees will need to be paid for all riders regardless of distance to their school, except students who have been screened into district programs through the district's Learning Support Services, for bussing.

The new transportation fee schedule was approved by the Board of Education in May 2012, following public meetings and consultation in the Fall of 2011. The Board and district administration felt the new fee system addresses the issue of equity in fees that was raised in public consultations.

All Call For Secondary School Apprentices

For example, at a restaurant, on a construction site, in an automotive shop, on a dairy farm, or in a hair salon?



If so, you may be eligible to enroll in a **Secondary School Apprenticeship and** earn a \$1,000.00 scholarship.

If you are a high school student working part-time in a trade, you are probably a "hidden apprentice." By registering as a Secondary School Apprentice, you will be able to earn course credits for the work you're already doing, become eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship, and get a head start on earning your trade certification. Talk to your school's career facilitator about the kind of work that qualifies, and about registering as a Secondary School Apprentice or call the District Career Programs Office at (604) 504-4618, local 1802.
