# Subject: Transportation/Bus Fee Changes September 2013

Please be aware that as of the start of the 2013-2014 school year this September, all eligible riders of school district buses will be charged \$200 a year. So, fees will need to be paid for all riders regardless of distance to their school, except students who have been screened into district programs through the district's Learning Support Services, for bussing.

The new transportation fee schedule was approved by the Board of Education in May 2012, following public meetings and consultation in the Fall of 2011. The Board and district administration felt the new fee system addresses the issue of equity in fees that was raised in public consultations.




Benefits include complimentary food, volunteer t-shirt (wear with pride!), learning new skills, gaining new experiences, making new friends, and most important of all, help make a difference!

# All Call For Secondary School Apprentices

For example, at a restaurant, on a construction site, in an automotive shop, on a dairy farm, or in a hair salon?



If so, you may be eligible to enroll in a **Secondary School Apprenticeship and** earn a \$1,000.00 scholarship.

If you are a high school student working part-time in a trade, you are probably a "hidden apprentice." By registering as a Secondary School Apprentice, you will be able to earn course credits for the work you're already doing, become eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship, and get a head start on earning your trade certification. Talk to your school's career facilitator about the kind of work that qualifies, and about registering as a Secondary School Apprentice or call the District Career Programs Office at (604) 504-4618, local 1802.
