Student Academic Excellence

- Monies have been allocated to support instruction for departments at ATSS and include areas such as Social Studies, Science, PE, Music, Art, Foods, Shops, Modern Languages, and especially Math and English and English Language Arts.
- Monies have been allocated for textbooks and guides for these areas.
- Memberships to additional on-line textbooks and resources such as Criterion on Demand, IXL and Science Techbook are also supported. Further resources such as the Social Studies Current Events resource, What in The World, the English resource, NewsELA, also supported.
- Monies have been allocated to support teacher professional development around developing
 and maintaining a supportive school climate for students social / emotional / academic wellbeing. Titan DNA and Sabre DNA (Dreams/Needs/Abilities) initiatives are part of this effort.
- Monies have been allocated for backup school-owned Chromebooks are purchased and
 maintained as temporary loaners to support students in our 1-1 laptop learning environment to
 ensure seamless, continued access to our learning technology, particularly in our COVID-19
 reality where our schools are able to be highly responsive to potential changes in direction of
 face-to-face and on-line learning from the Ministries of Health and Education.
- Teacher collaboration time includes opportunities to keep current on the broad tools that Google offers through its Google Suite Platform

Positive School Culture

- Monies have been allocated to leadership programs at both schools, the WEB program at ATMS
 and the Grad Program at ATSS strive for creating fun and positive activities for students to help
 create a sense of belonging and pride in their schools. The Grad Legacy project is a strong effort
 to focus our Grade 12 Graduates on leaving a positive legacy for the upcoming students.
- ATSS staff shirts promote unity and belonging among staff and is noticed by students.
- Monies have been allocated recently at ATSS to support lunch time intramurals, though with COVID-19, this initiative has been put on hold.
- Monies have been allocated for special guests to ATSS in recent years to encourage pro-social behaviour. Presentations such as Art-Starts groups, anti-Gang messaging from police, pro-social use of on-line technology and apps from police, Cops for Cancer tour visit with our school liaison officer, Const. Dyck as special guest.
- Monies have been allocated to target staffing in explorations/electives to students from Grades 6-12 -- adding Shop and Art to the ATMS explorations offerings has been a boon for engaging students, supporting their creative interests, and increasing their enjoyment of school and giving opportunity to be proud of their talents.
