



10th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION AND BBQ





Effective TUESDAY, Feb 17, 2015 Abbotsford Child & Youth Mental Health INTAKE Services are accessed through our *new* Child and Youth Mental Health Intake Clinic

NO appointments, WALK-IN only

This clinic is for intake to Child and Youth Mental Health services and does not apply to youth/families already accessing Child and Youth Mental Health services.

Parents/caregivers are encouraged to only bring the child or youth who is seeking services with them to the intake clinic, as childminding is not provided on-site. Older children and youth are encouraged to attend the intake clinic with their families whenever possible. Youth also have the option of attending the clinic on their own as a private self-referral.

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

All Call For Secondary School Apprentices

Grade 10, 11, 12 students: Are you currently working in a trade?

For example, are you working at a restaurant, on a construction site, in an automotive shop, on a dairy farm, or in a hair salon?



If so, you may be eligible to enroll in a Secondary School Apprenticeship and earn a \$1,000.00 scholarship.

If you are a high school student working part-time in a trade, you are probably a "hidden apprentice." By registering as a Secondary School Apprentice, you will be able to earn course credits for the work you're already doing, become eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship, and get a head start on earning your trade certification. Talk to your school's career facilitator about the kind of work that qualifies, and about registering as a Secondary School Apprentice or call the District Career Programs Office at (604) 504-4618, local 1802.
