Principal's Message

Well the second semester is underway. The time has seemed to go very fast. It will be Spring Break before we notice. With marks being completed, we will hand out our report cards to students on Mon. Feb. 23. Please look for them to come home with your son or daughter on that afternoon.

Course Planning:

Course planning for next year will begin on Tues. Feb. 24. Please be in communication with your child about which courses they will be taking. Also remember that a number of our Grade 11 and 12 academic subjects have pre-requisites which have to be met before gaining entry. This is done to ensure that your son or daughter have a reasonable chance of success in the next level. We have found that students who have not met the pre-requisites are simply not prepared for the next level and are typically not successful. Attendance:

Attendance is very important to us and we hope to you as well. You need to know if your son or daughter is absent from school without your permission. As a result we urgently ask that you ensure that you contact the school, the day of, if possible if your child is absent from school with your permission. Otherwise they will be marked as absent without excuse which could impact their ability to write exams or assignments missed etc. You can simply contact the school at 604-850-7029 and leave a message at any time of the day.

Drop off and Pickup:

As our parking lot is very busy especially after school please be mindful of those who are trying to leave and try to not block parking spaces or exits. We have a number of buses parked at the end of school day and are waiting for their students. They have a scheduled run and need to be at other schools to pick up and make exchanges. We are trying to clear the line-up out of the parking lot to ensure that they get away on time. Grad events:


