Have a great Spring Break and I trust all of our students will return safely to us on Mon. Mar. 30.



Dear School Principals and Pac Committees,

With the continued decline in the Canadian dollar we have no other choice but to increase all the uniform items we currently import from the USA. Canada doesn't currently have a school uniform supplier so we don't have an option but to import from the USA. We are looking at possibly changing our polo's to a Canadian supplier in order maintain pricing but in some cases when a particular color is needed that we can't find in Canada we will continue to import polo's for that particular school.

Our dollar currently sits at .79 cents US and is predicted to stay there for some time. We are currently reviewing our pricing and will start with an increase of 10%, but if our dollar continues to decline we will have to review pricing again in late July 2015.

The increase will be effective May 1" as that's the date we do all our bulk buying so the new stock will come in at the new prices.


